CROSS KEYS VILLAGE CEO TO RETIRE

CROSS KEYS/NEW OXFORD, Pa. – Jeff Evans, President and Chief Executive Officer for Cross Keys Village and The Brethren Home Foundation, has announced his upcoming retirement effective September 6, 2024, after 12 years of service.

Jeff began working in the field of aging services in 1974 and became a nursing home administrator in 1982 at the age of 23. Since then, he served as President and part-owner of a multi-state chain of nursing homes and as CEO over two non-profit, church-affiliated Continuing Care Retirement Communities. His career endeavors included numerous building construction and renovation projects and garnered national recognitions. In 2021, Jeff was awarded Icon Honors by the Central Penn Business Journal for his notable success as a business leader in the field of aging services. While at Cross Keys Village, Jeff excelled at being a thought leader and change agent during a time of evolution for our industry and campus community. With a focus on organizational development, he embarked on a multi-year initiative to advance Cross Keys Village's capabilities and elevate quality of life across the campus. During his tenure, he presided over \$75 million in new building developments and laid the foundation for constructing another \$85 million in projects.

"Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community has grown, thrived, and been enriched because of the vision Jeff cast early on during his tenure and brilliantly implemented," said Traci Rabenstein, Chair of The Brethren Home Foundation's Board of Directors. "His servant leadership mindset provided the strong sense of purpose and drive that helped our community become who we are today. While we will certainly miss Jeff, we pray God's blessing over him as he enters a new chapter of life and praise God for the legacy, he is leaving imprinted within us as we move into the future."

The Board of Directors has established a succession plan with a Search Committee and the engagement of an Executive Search Firm. An announcement of the next CEO of Cross Keys Village is expected later this year.
