The following are fiction books; some are part of a series.



#### A Million Little Choices by Tamera Alexander

One house. Two women. Two centuries. Claire finds herself in a crumbling relationship living in a house she

never desired. Charlotte is trapped in an abusive marriage trying to protect her unborn child and enslaved members of the household. Can both women discover the long-hidden secrets with power to restore – and will they make a needed change?

#### One Final Target by Janice Cantore

Every police officer knows it's dangerous to serve a warrant – but no one expects an IED to detonate, killing four officers in one deadly explosion. Now it's up to the lone survivor, Sergeant Jodie King, to solve the case. But she's hampered by trauma. And brand-new detective Sam Gresham fears Jodie may actually be the intended target!?

#### Katharine Wright Mystery Series by Amanda Flower

<u>To Slip the Bonds of Earth</u> – While not as famous as her older siblings Wilbur and Orville, the celebrated inventors of flight, Katharine Wright is equally inventive – especially when it comes to solving crimes – in *USA Today* bestselling author Amanda Flower's radiant new historical mystery series inspired by the real sister of the Wright Brothers. (This is the first book in the series.)

#### Hope Harbor Series by Irene Hannon

<u>Sandcastle Inn</u> – Vienna Price never intended to return for more than a passing visit to Oregon and all the bad memories she'd left behind. But when your career tanks, home is where you go to nurse your wounds and chart a new course. Only temporarily, of course – because as much as she loves her quirky mom, anything more than a short stay would drive them both crazy. A trip to Oregon isn't in Matt Quinn's plans either, until a perfectly timed appeal for help arrives from his sister. What better place to decompress after a shattering loss than a quiet, seaside town named Hope Harbor? But R&R isn't on the agenda when he arrives to find his sister's new enterprise on life support. (The other books in the series are in order: <u>Hope Harbor</u>, <u>Sea Rose Lane</u>, <u>Sandpiper Cove</u>, <u>Pelican Point</u>, <u>Driftwood Bay</u>, <u>Starfish Pier</u>, <u>Blackberry Beach</u>, <u>Sea Glass Cottage</u>, and <u>Windswept Way</u>.)

#### With Every Memory by Janine Rosche

After a tragic accident robs her of the last nine years of memories, Lori Mendenhall comes home to a family completely different than she remembers. As her memory returns and past secrets resurface, it will take all of them to repair what's been broken and find a new future together.


#### Texas Ever After Series by Karen Witemeyer

<u>If the Boot Fits</u> – When Samantha Dearing's rancher father hosts a ball to find her a husband, she balks at the prospect of marrying a man not of her own choosing. After a mystery guest saves her brother's life and then disappears, leaving only his boot behind, her search for its owner leads to an ending more enchanting than she imagined. (This is the second book in the series, the first book is <u>Fairest of Heart</u>.)

#### Alaskan Cyber Hunters Series by Kimberley Woodhouse

<u>8 Down</u> – Investigator Carrie Kintz is new blood with the Alaska Bureau of Investigation in Anchorage. But with a serial killer on the loose, there's no easing into the job. It's sink or swim. The only clues to help law enforcement stop this madman are the taunts he drops into crossword puzzles across the country – always in the same 8 DOWN position. Carrie is desperate to prove her worth to the force and the community by catching the killer. But when she discovers signs that these deaths are just the tip of the iceberg in a frighteningly elaborate cyberattack, it's time to admit she needs help. (This is the second book in the series, the first book is <u>26</u> <u>Below</u>.)

### Witness Commission May Food Pantry Needs: Dish Detergent



April flowers bring May flowers? This spring it seems that March showers bring April flowers, then they get frosted!

Here are just a few highlights from our outreach programs.

For the last 12-15 years, the Carlisle Truck Stop Ministry has relied on the banquets to provide a third of their annual operating budget. But banquet attendance has decreased over recent years and the banquets take a significate amount of time and funds, and they are at breakeven. As a result, they are suspending these banquets and will continue to need financial support. Newsletters will be 3-4 times a year with a donation envelope included. What impact does the Truck Stop Ministry make? This is an experience from Chaplain Dave:

"Let me share with you one special divine encounter I recently had. It involves a driver I have known for a number of years. He called me on a Wednesday (not my normal workday) and asked if I wanted to have breakfast with him. I, of course, said yes and we arranged to meet at the Sunnyside restaurant in Carlisle for an early morning breakfast. I arrived and waited for him to park his tractor. As he stepped down off his tractor, I noticed a significant difference in his gait and his mannerisms. As I watched him shuffle across the parking lot, I asked him if he was okay. He mumbled something and we walked into the restaurant. As we sat down at the table, I noticed that he was gasping for air. I said to him 'I need to get you to the emergency room now' but his reply was, 'Not 'till I have my eggs and grits.'

So, after breakfast I drove him to the emergency room where the ER staff immediately began processing him. It ended up that he had significant congestive heart failure (stage four), kidney failure and an extremely high sugar level from his diabetes. During the stabilization process of this driver by the medical staff, several of them commented to me, 'It's a good thing you got this driver in here because nine chances out of ten, he would have just crawled into his truck and passed away.'

The driver ended up spending seven days in the hospital with the understanding that when he was discharged, his driving days were over. He had been driving for 38 years, the last 10 of which were with a company out of Oregon. The unfortunate thing about many of the drivers, and the trucking companies, is that the companies are more concerned about the loads in the truck than they are about the drivers. This driver had to get home to Florida to follow up with his local doctors on his medical situation. The company refused to provide a bus ticket, airplane ticket, or allow him to rent a car to get home. After much searching, we were able to find an airplane ticket to his home in Florida for \$125. I took him to the airport, prayed with him and he got on his flight to get home to begin the healing process."

Samaritan's Purse Christmas Shoebox update: 11,330,126 boxes were collected worldwide. 10,051,570 were from just the U.S. Our Juniata Valley Area collected 11,477 boxes and 125 of those were packed through the online app. We are still looking to have a bus go this November from Juniata County. If you are interested, please let Dina Zug know as this needs to be planned in August.

The PA Hunger Association Meat Canning Project in February canned 36,000 lb of chicken and produced 22,827 cans of chicken. 100 cases were distributed to local organizations. The rest will be sent to third world countries.


