
We are thinking that one or two practices prior to then should be sufficient. Dates and times for practice will be announced later.



Amish Candy Shop Mysteries Series by Amanda Flower

<u>Premeditated Peppermint</u> – Bailey King's ex-boyfriend, celebrity chef Eric Sharp, shows up to film an authentic Amish Christmas at Bailey's candy shop, but ends up asking for her help clearing his name after his executive producer is murdered and he is blamed. (This is the third book in the series; the other books are <u>Assaulted Caramel</u> and <u>Lethal Licorice</u>.)

Red Glove Series by Karen Kingsbury

<u>Gideon's Gift</u> – Holiday tale of a man who has lost all hope, an irrepressible child suffering from a terrible illness, and the one small act of love and faith that will give them both the greatest gift of all. (Book 1)

<u>Maggie's Miracle</u> – Megan Wright spent one unforgettable summer week with a boy when they were both teens. And despite a lifetime of heartache and bad choices, she has never let go of his magical definition of love, even if she has trouble believing in it. After college, Megan settled for a relationship of convenience. Now she's a high-powered attorney and, after the death of her husband two years ago, has been looking for help with her lonely young son. (Book 2)

<u>Sarah's Song</u> – Every year, Sarah Lindeman celebrates Christmas the same way: placing one special ornament on her tiny tree on each of the twelve days of Christmas. It is her time to remember where she came from, who she is today, and how, long ago, a song gave her another chance at love. But this year the ritual is different. This year, a desperate young woman is listening – a nurse who cares for Sarah at the Greer Retirement Village. (Book 3)

<u>Hannah's Hope</u> – Fifteen-year-old Hannah feels lonely, with wealthy parents who have little time for her, until she learns that Jack is not her biological father and she begins the search for the man who is. (Book 4)

Tree of Life Series by Olivia Newport

What You Said to Me - When fifteen-year-old Tisha Crowder gets caught shoplifting, attorney Nolan Duffy tries to protect her from consequences that could rattle her already troubled life. His daughter, Jillian, feels like she's the one being punished instead – by having Tisha assigned to work with her on a backlog of genealogy files. Tisha doesn't seem interested in taking the job seriously, and Jillian's patience wears thin. (This is the fourth book in the series; the other books are: The Inn at Hidden Run, In the Cradle Lies, and When I Meet You.)

Gone to the Dogs Mysteries Series by Janice Thompson

Barking Up the Wrong Tree – Inquisitive, detail-oriented, veterinarian Kristin Keller prides herself on winning over any dog. But has this self-proclaimed dog whisperer finally met her match in a Sheltie named Remington who has just won the Texas state agility course competition? The champion pooch is acting out of sorts – almost as if he is not the same dog. Has he, by chance, been switched out with another dog just before the next big competition? Kristin and the other Lone Star employees will do anything to help the Atkinson family figure out this mystery surrounding their beloved Remington. (This is the third book in the series; the other books are: Off the Chain by Janice Thompson and Dog Days of Summer by Kathleen Y'Barbo)

Alaska Air One Rescue Series by Susan May Warren

One Last Promise – After years as a pilot of a Navy rescue chopper, Arlo "Moose" Mulligan returned home to start Air One Rescue – and made a name for himself. He loves his job, his life, and his routines, which include breakfast at the Skyport Diner, always at one of Tillie Young's tables. She's sweet and pretty, but Moose knows his life has no room for anything more. Until the day Tillie shows up beaten and desperate and needing his help. Tillie Young never thought her ex would track her to Alaska, but somehow, he's found her. When he kidnaps her daughter, she'll do anything to get her back – even enlist help from her favorite grumpy customer. But Moose Mulligan is no match for a former MMA boxer and possible child trafficker, right? (This is the third book in the series; the other books are One Last Shot and One Last Chance.)

For those who were included in last year's Directory, please take a moment to review that information and use the form to make any changes needed or write your name and "no changes" on the form.


