Can Hanna uncover the truth – when someone's desperate to silence it?

Golden State Treasure Series by Mary Connealy

Whispers of Fortune – Brody MacKenzie arrives at an orphan school in search of his runaway brothers who possess an old journal leading to a lost treasure. Ellie Hart runs the ranch's orphan school and, together with Brody, they embark on a thrilling search, discovering love amidst family secrets and old adversaries. (This is the first book in the series.)

A Shanahan Match Series by Jody Hedlund

A Wager with the Matchmaker – Kiernan Shanahan is intent on securing his name and fortune free of his father's shadow. But when he finds a position for Alannah Darragh in his household to keep her safe from a dangerous family situation, the sparks that fly between them are only the start of a wily matchmaker's scheme...no matter how much both fight it. (This is the third book in the series; the other books are <u>Calling on the Matchmaker</u> and <u>Saved by the Matchmaker</u>.)

The Jewels of Kalispell Series by Tracie Peterson & Kimberley Woodhouse

<u>The Unexpected Grace</u> – Actor Parker Bennett returns home to perform at the Kalispell Opera House. When he encounters Johanna St. John, his first love, will long-buried emotions awaken? (This is the third book in the series; the other books are <u>The Heart's Choice</u> and <u>With Each Tomorrow</u>.)

All We Thought We Knew by Michelle Shocklee

1969. When Mattie Taylor's twin brother was killed in Vietnam, she lost

her best friend and the only person who really understood her. Now, news that her mother is dying sends Mattie back home, despite blaming her father for Mark's death. Mama's last wish is that Mattie would read some old letters stored in a trunk, from people Mattie doesn't even know. Mama insists they hold the answers Mattie is looking for.

1942. Ava Delaney is picking up the pieces of her life following her husband's death at Pearl Harbor. Living with her mother-in-law on a secluded farm in Tennessee is far different than the life Ava imagined when she married only a few short months ago. In the midst of pain and loss two women must come face-to-face with their own assumptions about what they thought they knew about themselves and others. What they discover will lead to a far greater appreciation of their own legacies and the love of those dearest to them.

Home to Green Creek Series by Lauraine Snelling with Kiersti Giron

<u>Land of Dreams</u> – Norwegian immigrant Amalia Gunderson and her ward, Ruth Forsberg, arrive in Iowa to claim the boardinghouse Ruth has inherited, despite opposition from a difficult cousin. While Amalia looks for her long-lost brother, her relationship with an attorney unfolds as she and Ruth navigate through love, loss, and unexpected friendships. (This is the first book in the series.)
