THE COST of DISCIPLESHIP—a pondering of the D.E.

Then He (Jesus) began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days, rise again (Mark 8: 31, NRSVue)

There is an old song, I remember from youth that we sang in my home church, entitled, "Are Ye Able" which has always brought a tear to my eye, as each verse raises the question about my (OUR) capability of staying on the pathway of Iesus especially in times of adversity, discomfort, and suffering. Another question we need to ask ourselves is whether we can we be full disciples of Jesus Christ without the cost of suffering?

As we journey thru the season of Lent, it is a good opportunity to better understand the full thrust of being a disciple of Christ and if that is something, we who say we are Christians, are earnest about accomplishing? Keep before you, the Mark 8:34 text as we move through the weeks before the crucifixion and Easter, and think about what it will take to be a devoted follower of Jesus, especially when: illness, no funds for the "extras of living in this world", hunger, death, etc, etc cross our paths? Scripture says in Mark 8:34 that Jesus looked over the crowd of people who had been following He and the disciples. Jesus gave those folks an invitation to join Him as His disciples. BUT, Jesus' conditions shocked the people of that day...He said, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." --- "Are ye able?" In this text, Peter took exception to Jesus' comments about suffering and called Jesus on his stance. Jesus, in turn, calls Peter to task, indicating that Satin is speaking thru Peter at that moment.

Remember the text in Matthew 19: beginning with vs 16 – where the rich young ruler questioned Jesus of what good he needed to do to have eternal life? The man in the scripture text walked away from Jesus with his head drooping when Jesus lays out the difficult road it will take for that to happen. SO, can we say "Lord, we are able...our spirits are thine"? Are we willing to accept our CROSS in this life? If Jesus suffered and was rejected by the "leaders" of His time, are we not also rejecting Christ in those times when our cross seems difficult to bear? Let us help one another bear the crosses that come into our lives, knowing they are learning times.

Sisters and Brothers, there is a price tag for discipleship and even we, who embrace the church, do not like the price tag and sometimes walk away. It is much more appealing to pay thousands of dollars to attend a sports activity then get in the suffering line of following Christ. Are you equipped for the suffering that will come? Easter's promise should be a sufficient reason for our journey and bring with it the Peace that only Christ can offer during the hard times. "Are Ye Able", said the Master to be crucified with Me?

You're welcome to bring one or more items from the list, or to donate cash for purchasing items for the baby layettes to be donated to the Capital Area Pregnancy Center.



JEANNE DAVIES serves as the Executive Director for the Anabaptist Disabilities Network. Jeanne has a Master of Divinity degree from Bethany Theological Seminary, a Graduate Certificate in Disability and Ministry from Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan, and a Graduate Certificate in Homiletic Peer Coaching from Vanderbilt University Divinity School. Jeanne is the author of *Believing and Belonging: An Accessible Anabaptist Membership Curriculum*, an illustrated curriculum of 26 lessons for youth and adults written at a third-grade reading level.

In the U.S., more than 25% of adults have some type of disability. About 8.5% of children have

been diagnosed with a developmental disability. People living in rural areas experience higher rates of disability than those in urban areas. Whether we are aware or not, we have many disabled people in our congregations. Many more are not present because of barriers to access and belonging. Jesus invited everyone to the table, meeting needs and calling forth gifts. How might we create congregations that have a place for everybody, and live into the fullness of the body of Christ?

Jeanne will guide us through three sessions:

Tuesday evening: What Disables Us? Wednesday morning: Creating Accessible Congregations Wednesday afternoon: Accessible Worship


